CURRENT POSITION:

Branch Chief, Country Programs, Director of Prevention, Education and Training, the position requires comprehensive planning, direction and leadership for the prevention staff and by providing the overall program that spans over 50 countries with sound objectives including comprehensive HIV prevention messages, behavioral change communication, voluntary medical male circumcision, testing and counseling, general adult and youth prevention, most at risk populations, treatment and prevention with positives. In addition to prevention, directs the Military International HIV Training Program in collaboration with the Defense Health Agency, Department of Defense HIV/AIDS Prevention Program, the Naval Medical Center, San Diego and two San Diego universities - the University of California, San Diego and San Diego State University. The San Diego based program is a mini-residency in the clinical management of HIV/AIDS patients, which is designed for foreign military health care providers/personnel currently managing patients infected HIV in their countries.

Developed assessment measures to evaluate the effectiveness of the training program by utilizing instruments such as a pre-post testing, daily evaluations, overall evaluations and a post-course follow-up survey on all course participants. Completed multiple country epidemiological studies regarding HIV seroprevalence and behavioral surveys including Rwanda, Cameroon, Democratic Republic of the Congo and currently working on new seroprevalence studies in Malawi, Democratic Republic of the Congo, Sierra Leone, Angola, Central African Republic and others. In addition, my team is working on a sexual networking study that is complete and is currently being analyzed with data from Zambia, Democratic Republic of the Congo, and Senegal.

Supports the Presidents Emergency Plan For AIDS Relief (PEPFAR) and is the senior technical advisor for HIV Testing Services (HTS). Continues to support all the PEPFAR countries including Sub-Saharan countries, Central Asian countries, Western Hemisphere countries and others. This position requires in-depth knowledge on HIV prevention, care, and treatment programs. Country manager for 22 African countries and previously worked with Central Asian and Latin American countries - developing, managing, and evaluating HIV programs regarding prevention, counseling and testing, gender, and HIV care and treatment. In addition to the

prevention, care, and treatment programs, particular attention is paid to law, culture, and the adaptation of other policies that may apply.

Serves on various technical working groups including the Co-Chair for HIV Testing, Counseling and Linkage Technical Working Group and Prevention with Positives Task Force, and was previously on the Gender and General and Youth Prevention Technical working group. Specific strengths/expertise in HIV prevention including testing and counseling, gender related issues, gender based violence, military and uniformed personnel, policies, and general HIV prevention.
