MEET THE INVITED SPEAKERS



Dr. Samir Gupta (Keynote Speaker) is a Professor of Medicine at the University of California San Diego, and Staff Physician at the Jennifer Moreno Department of Veterans Affairs San Diego Healthcare System. His research focuses on the screening and prevention of colorectal cancer. This work has included multiple randomized trials of strategies to boost colorectal cancer screening participation in underserved communities, as well as large scale epidemiologic studies of strategies to prevent cancer after baseline colonoscopy with polypectomy, funded by the National Cancer Institute, Department of Veterans Affairs, and others. He serves as

chair of the National Comprehensive Cancer Network's annually issued Genetic/Familial High-Risk Assessment: Colorectal, Endometrial, Gastric cancer guidelines, and led the 2020 US Multisociety Task Force on Colorectal Cancer recommendations for follow up after colonoscopy and polypectomy. Dr. Gupta is an active teacher and mentor, and his medical practice includes performing routine GI procedures, and evaluation and management of individuals at increased risk for GI cancer based on family history and genetic diagnoses.




Dr. Maria Josse Navarro-Ibarra (Invited Panel) is a Research Professor at the Mexicali Faculty of Medicine, Universidad Autónoma de Baja California where she oversees the master's program in Nutritional Sciences. Additionally, Dr. Navarro-Ibarra serves as an Adjunct Assistant Professor in the Division of Epidemiology at the San Diego State University School of Public Health. Her research primarily investigates nutritional risk factors, lifestyle behaviors, and environmental exposure biomarkers related to non-communicable diseases. In addition to leading a research group dedicated to translational nutrition, Dr. Navarro-Ibarra

also co-leads the Crossboarder Translational Cancer Research Alliance (CANTRAC).



Dr. Humberto Parada Jr (Invited Panel) is an Associate Professor at the San Diego State University School of Public Health, and Head of the Division of Epidemiology and Biostatistics. Dr. Parada obtained his PhD in Epidemiology from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill in 2016 and joined SDSU as Assistant Professor in 2017 after completing a postdoctoral fellowship in the UNC Lineberger Comprehensive Cancer Center and the UNC Department of Epidemiology. His research focuses on identifying environmental, behavioral, and genetic factors that influence the development and progression of cancer, and

understanding these associations within the context of health disparities, particularly among US Hispanics/Latinos.



Dr. Tianying Wu (*Invited Panel*) is an Associate Professor at the San Diego State University School of Public Health. Dr. Wu is a molecular and nutritional epidemiologist with a strong passion for precision nutrition and medicine. Her research is dedicated to uncovering how dietary and lifestyle factors differentially impact aging-related outcomes across diverse population subgroups. She investigates these variations by integrating underlying physiological and subclinical conditions, as well as demographic differences among individuals, including cancer survivors, who experience accelerated aging compared to the general population.



Dr. Mark Beatty (Invited County Address) is the Assistant Medical Director of Epidemiology and Immunization Services at the County of San Diego Health and Human Services Agency. Prior to his work at the County, Dr. Beatty was a US Public Health Service Officer, serving two years with the Navajo Nation in Crownpoint, New Mexico and six years with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention as an Epidemic Intelligence Service (EIS) officer. During his time at the International Vaccine Institute in Seoul, South Korea, Dr. Beatty focused his research on global health and vaccines and continued to lead global clinical influenza vaccine trials at Novartis Vaccines and

Diagnostics after his time at the Institute.
