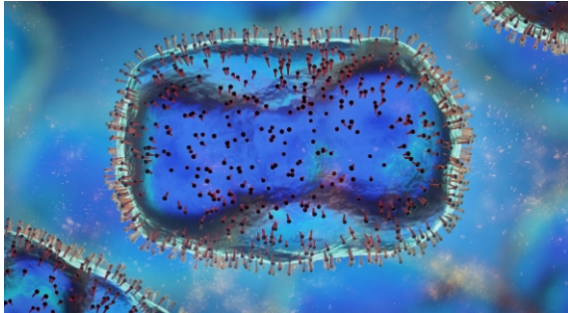

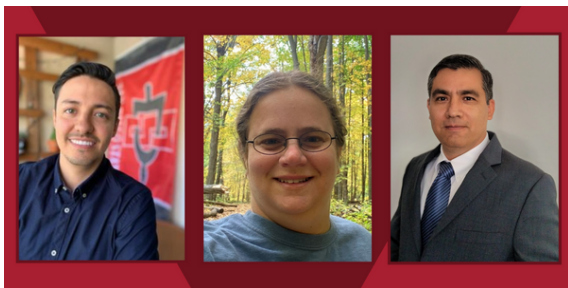
**What is Monkeypox? Q&A with SDSU Professor Richard Shaffer**
