Paid Family Leave

****Paid family leave** is available for those who stay home because they need to take care of someone who has contracted the virus (Covid-19) or who has been quarantined (must be certified by a medical professional). Learn how to file a Paid Family Leave Claim HERE.

Disability Benefits/Paid Sick Leave

****Disability benefits /paid sick leave** are available for those who have actually contracted the virus themselves or who have been exposed to it and are quarantined (must be certified by a medical professional in the case of Disability Benefits). Learn how to file a Disability Insurance <u>Claim HERE</u>.

Unemployment Benefits

****Unemployment benefits** are available to those whose hours have been reduced or who have lost their job due to coronavirus measures (and it also applies to those who choose to stay home due to underlying health issues making them more vulnerable). The Governor has waived the 1 week wait time and the person may not be required to be actively looking for work (as is usually required). Learn how to file an Unemployment Insurance Claim HERE.

- Unfortunately though, this benefit is not available to undocumented persons whose hours are reduced or lose their job for reasons related to COVID-19, etc.
- SCHOOL CLOSURES: If your child's school is closed and you have to miss work to care for them. You might qualify for Unemployment Insurance benefits. <u>Learn</u> how to file an Unemployment Insurance Claim HERE.

Worker's Compensation

****Worker's comp** is available for those who are unable to do their usual job because they were exposed to and contracted Covid-19 while in the regular course of their job (i.e. healthcare workers)

Tax Assistance

Directly from the <u>Employment Development Department</u>: "Employers experiencing a hardship as a result of COVID-19 may request up to a 60-day extension of time from the EDD to file their state payroll reports and/or deposit state payroll taxes without penalty or interest. A written request for extension must be received within 60 days from the original delinquent date of the payment or return.

Women Infant and Children Services

- WIC offices in San Diego and Imperial County continue to provide services to current and new participants. For health and safety purposes, WIC is providing appointments and food benefits by phone. For families who are new to WIC or have not yet received the WIC Card, please direct them to find their closest WIC office via <u>www.sdwic.com</u>.
- Since many WIC-approved items may be unavailable or the item may not be marked appropriately, WIC is highly encouraging families on the program to download the California WIC App. The app has a barcode scanner that will help them confirm if a food is WIC-approved. The app is available for free in the Google Play and Apple stores.
- Note: If you can afford to purchase other items, please try to avoid purchasing items with a WIC logo on the shelf price tag when grocery shopping. If stores run out of WIC-approved options, WIC families will not be able to purchase these foods. Additionally, if a grocery store is out of WIC infant formula, direct WIC families to contact their local WIC office for help.

- 5. YWCA San Diego County offers shelter and services for Domestic Violence Victims/Survivors 24/7, their hotline is free, confidential and operates 24/7. Availability for singles, families: small and large. Spanish available, call 619-234-3164.
- 6. Family Justice Center (FJC)
 - Physical location is temporarily closed to the public, but the Family Justice Center staff are providing telephonic advocacy, resource referrals, and safety planning services to victims of domestic violence, sexual assault and sex trafficking at 619-533-6000 from 8:00-5:00 Monday through Friday
 - b. Community Partners continue to offer services remotely. Therapists are providing services through telehealth. Forensic examinations continue to be on site. Palomar Health is implementing procedures if a DV and/or SA victim has symptoms of COVID-19. San Diego Police Department, DV Unit still on site but they are not offering police reports to DV clients. If police reports are needed, it can be done at SDPD headquarters downtown.
 - c. Restraining order attorneys are starting phone consult systems. There are challenges to assisting clients remotely.
 - d. Court houses are mostly closed until April 3 but ex parte requests for gun violence restraining orders and domestic violence restraining orders are still be accepted.
- 7. South Bay Community Services (SBCS)

- All DV services are still operating. Some are being offered virtually (ex: therapy and DV Advocacy), however shelter is still open and staffed. If you have any families in imminent danger and fleeing DV please encourage them to still reach out to our agency for a hotline screening: 1-800-640-2933
